 If not- Consider discounted purchasing through NARCANDirect.com
Educate officers on how to use NARCAN® Nasal Spray
☐ Issue NARCAN® Nasal Spray across the department
CREATE A LEAVE BEHIND PROGRAM AND/OR POST OVERDOSE RESPONSE PROGRAM
Acquire NARCAN® Nasal Spray designated for community distribution
 Explore if you are eligible to receive from a state or local distribution program
 If not- Consider discounted purchasing through NARCANDirect.com
Develop a program model to actively distribute to those who may have experienced
an opioid overdose as well as family, friends, and potential bystanders
 Determine if you'd like to leave NARCAN® behind immediately after an overdose or if you'd like to conduct a follow up visit 1-2 days afterwards
Explore if community partners are available to assist with visits
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MAKE NARCAN® NASAL SPRAY AVAILABLE AT YOUR STATION AND WITHIN THE COMMUNITY
Stock NARCAN® Nasal Spray in static locations such as vending
machines and distribution boxes
☐ Distribute NARCAN® Nasal Spray upon request to community members
Provide NARCAN® to community organizations for active outreach in areas
where higher numbers of overdoses may occur
