Does OSHA require NARCAN® Nasal Spray?

OSHA current doesn't regulate stocking the drug, they recommend employers should assess the specific needs of their worksite periodically and augment the first aid kit appropriately. 48 states have enacted Good Samaritan laws.

Does using NARCAN® Nasal Spray have to be reported?

Non-prescription drugs are exempted from the OSHA log requirement and their use is considered to be first aid. It may become recordable when administered in conjunction with other criteria for recording injuries and illnesses, such as a worker becomes unconscious.¹

What are the possible side effects of NARCAN® Nasal Spray?

When using this product some people may experience symptoms when they wake up, such as shaking, sweating, nausea, or feeling angry. This is to be expected.

How should NARCAN® Nasal Spray be stored?

At room temperature or refrigerated: between 36°F to 77°F (2°C to 25°C). Do not freeze. Avoid excessive heat above 104°F (40°C). Protect from light. Please adhere to the expiration date as printed on the package.
